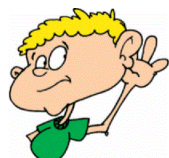
PARENT DISCUSSIONS for KINDERGARTEN and LEARNING SUPPORT

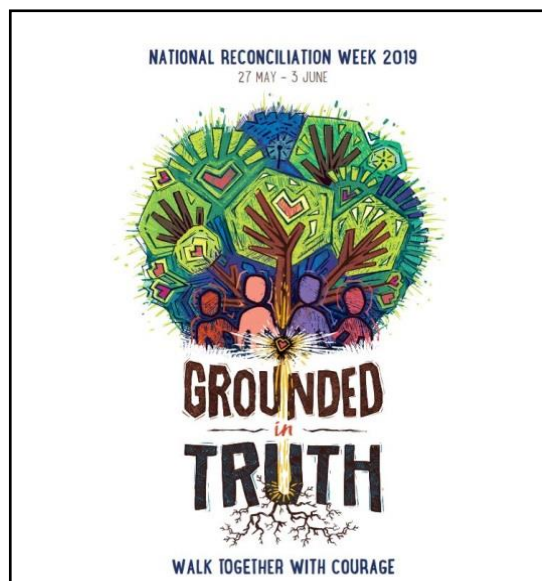
RECONCILIATION WEEK ASSEMBLY – Friday 7 June

Selfies with Pets!

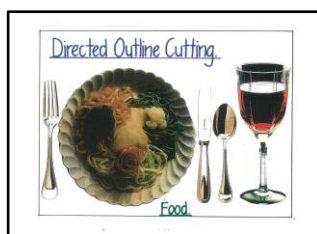
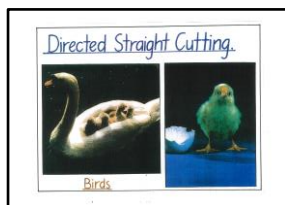
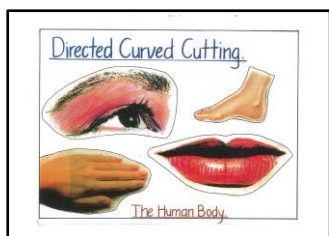

Cutting Skills

We are working on the quality of student's cutting skills K-6. Feel free to ask your child to show you how they are progressing. Students are taught to point the scissors away from his/her body and simply open and close the scissors (we call this the lazy hand because that is all this hand does). The other hand is very busy maneuvering the item being cut. If you Google 'cutting practise' you will find lots of great activities you can try at home. Alternatively old magazines and catalogues provide great opportunities for practising cutting skills. Here are some of the examples of the different types of cutting we do in The Art Room.



Handy Hint from The Art Room

Use a catalogue or unwanted magazine as a 'gluing magazine'. By simply opening the pages and placing down your item to be glued you can glue right up to and even over the edge of the item and keep your table top nice and clean. Once you have finished, close the magazine and trap the messy residual glue inside! This magazine can be kept on your child's desk or Homework Station for easy access.
